

World Heart Day at Freedom High School

World Heart Day training happened on Thursday, January 18. All 9th and 11th-grade students during their English Class went straight to the gym with their teacher and stayed there doing the training for the whole period. The firefighters and sheriffs were there to assist the students in the training. This training allows students to learn how to do CPR to have a chance to help someone's life that is in danger.

Since 2018, new laws have been increased in many states, and one of those laws was that schools are required to train students in First Aid / CPR before they graduate. In Florida, all 9th-11th graders are required to do this basic training. By having a school full of students trained in CPR it means more lives can be saved.

Students were expected to learn after finishing their training on World Heart Day. English teachers and firefighters taught everyone what to do if they see someone having a cardiac arrest. They told the students that they need to make sure that the area is safe before anyone does anything to save someone's life and also make sure the students know what an AED is and to get it if it is near them. By using an AED, it can increase the chances of helping the person with a cardiac arrest. In most real scenarios, the person will be doing CPR until the paramedics get to the person or until the person starts showing signs of breathing.

4 Your Eyez Only - An Absolute Marvel in Musical Storytelling

Jermaine Lamarr Cole, more famously known as J. Cole, dropped his fourth studio album on December 9th, 2016 “4 Your Eyez Only.” With its catchy jazz mixed with hip-hop production, artistic lyrics, and wordplay, this is an album that everybody should listen to at least once.

Following the story of J. Cole’s childhood friend, James McMillan Jr., who passed away at the age of 22 due to gang violence, the album transcends the more common tropes and stereotypes when it comes to rap music, as it discusses heavy topics such as racial discrimination, fatherhood, gang violence, and love. The main concept of the album is that it is for the eyes of James’s daughter so that she can understand her father’s life after his death. J. Cole raps from his perspective and parallels it with the perspective of his late friend, as they both had different upbringings. This album became very popular as it sold 363,000 copies in its first week of being released. 4 Your Eyez Only received nominations for Top Rap Album at the 2017 Billboard Music Awards, and Album of the Year at the 2017 BET Awards; it even debuted at number one on the Billboard 200.

The overall mood of the album has a mixture of many contrasting emotions throughout the 10-song tracklist. Songs like, “Deja Vu” and “Foldin Clothes” deal with falling in love and doing the small things to express that emotion, and songs like, “For Whom The Bell Tolls” and “Change” deal with James’s funeral and changing heavily due to your surroundings. One song that sticks out the most is the outro, which bears the same name as the album title; this song covers the entirety of James’s story from his and J. Cole’s perspective after he gets out of prison up until his death. This emotional outro also talks about how even if James did all these bad things, one thing that remained constant was the love he had for his daughter.

Star Wars: A New Hope - The Movie that Revolutionized Film.

On May 25th, 1977, a movie was released to theaters which would forever revolutionize the filmmaking industry as well as redefine modern day Sci-Fi and American pop-culture. This legendary film created by George Lucas would make the career of one of the most successful filmmakers in Hollywood history, going as far as to break box office records with it bringing in 307.2 million dollars worldwide, taking the spot of highest grossing movie of all time from Steven Spielberg's classic thriller "Jaws," until 1982.

Star Wars: A New Hope, or at the time just called "Star Wars" was a passion project for Lucas. It followed the story of a young orphan boy, Luke Skywalker, living in a desolate desert planet and leading a boring life of farming. By the end of the movie Luke is awarded a medal by the rebellion against the Intergalactic Empire for his role in destroying the largest space-station and planet-killing weapon the galaxy had ever seen. Throughout the movie we're introduced to various characters who play critical roles in Luke's story and his hero's journey. A mentor who passed onto him great wisdom and dies at the end of the end of the movie to push our hero out of his comfort zone, a sly crook who teams up with our hero for his own gain but develops a soft spot for them and sees value in things beyond cash reward, and more.

Aside from a beautiful story perfectly illustrating a hero's journey and the beginning of this film trilogy, Star Wars: A New Hope revolutionized film with its groundbreaking use of practical effects to bring the immersive and strange world of Star Wars to life on the big screen. George Lucas and his effects team put together a lot of elaborate methods of capturing the magic of this far-away galaxy on camera. In a time before CGI and green screens they had to get creative and used giant oil paintings as backgrounds for the setpieces of the film and used stop-motion animation to film the action packed chase scenes through space.

Star Wars: A New Hope is a revolutionary film for many reasons. It's iconic take on the hero's journey story archetype, the revolutionary special effects work, the amazing costume and set design of the world, the charismatic performances by well respected actors like Alec Guinness and Harrison Ford, and an original soundtrack yet to be topped by any film to have come out in the 47 years since its release.
