Come Enjoy a Nice Meal at First Watch

In the mood for breakfast, lunch, but not quite dinner? Then First Watch might be the restaurant for you! First Watch restaurants have been popping up all over Central Florida, and there's a good chance one is close to you too. First Watch was first founded in California, but moved their headquarters to Florida in 1986. They now have over 400 locations in 29 states.

I recently visited First Watch and got to try some of the food. They have a great variety of both breakfast and lunch foods. They have lots of options from pancakes to salads to sandwiches. They are open from 7:00 am to 2:30 pm and serve all of their food within those hours. Every season inspires different menu items that go along with the season. Since it is fall, they have pumpkin pancakes, million dollar harvest hash, cinnamon spice churros, and butternut squash bisque. They use fresh ingredients in every dish which makes the food taste great. Along with the food, they also have a variety of fresh juices. They have morning meditation fresh juice, which consists of orange juice, lemon juice, turmeric, organic ginger, agave nectar, and beet juice. They also have kale tonic fresh juice which is made up of kale, fuji apple, english cucumber, and lemon. They have purple haze which has lemon, cane sugar, butterfly pea flower tea, and a hint of lavender. Their seasonal option is pomegranate pear punch which is made up of pomegranate, pear, cane sugar, and lime.

First Watch is part of something called Project Sunrise. This is a collaboration between them and Mujeres en Café, which is a company located in Huila, Colombia. Mujeres en Café is a company made up of women, who produce coffee beans. These coffee beans are imported to First Watch and used in all of their coffee.

The service was very good, but the wait to get into the restaurant can get quite long. Overall, I would rate First Watch a 9/10. I highly recommend trying it out if you get the chance!
