



Freedom High School Community Service Form



Community Service is defined as identifying a social issue in the community. This requires students to look beyond themselves and reach out to an issue faced by our society (i.e. poverty, elderly citizen rights). Although it is not a requirement to graduate, community service hours are required for the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program. The completed hours will be recorded on the student's transcripts.

- Students must summarize, evaluate, and reflect on the volunteer experience using the designated form
- Students should keep copies of all documentation submitted to the school
- Students must complete the hours the summer before beginning 9th grade or after
- Students must perform the service during non-school hours
- Students must not be compensated either financially or with some other material benefit
- Court mandated community service cannot be used
- The activity must have a supervisor on site to evaluate and confirm the student participation.
- The service must be for a nonprofit organization and must address one or more social concerns (Service to youth, Quality of Life, Service to Senior Citizens, Health/Safety, Developmentally or Physically Disabled, Environmental/Historical Preservation, Art/Culture).
