

AP PHYSICS STUDY KEEPS ROLLING ALONG





This past week AP Physics C Mechanics students examined the Effect of Moment of Inertia. The test measured how resistant an object is to changes in its rotational motion in order to determine the torque needed for a desired acceleration. The demonstration looked at the effect of the difference in moment of inertia between a ring and disk rolling down an inclined plane.

The concepts being studied in our AP Physics classroom come alive with equipment funded by Lockheed Martin.

FREEDOM SGA EARNS HIGH HONORS AT FASC









from February 23rd-25th.


Our SGA council won a Gold Medallion award for our work during the 2023 year!


