
Underclassmen Picture Day


HANDS-ON EXPERIENCE

Classrooms Coming to Life

Students in Mr. Correa's Physics 1 Honors classes were given a demonstration on how to understand the conservation of momentum. The students stood on a spinning wheel while holding weights. The closer the weights were to the center axis, students would experience a decrease in the moment of inertia resulting in the wheel spinning faster. The experiment illustrated how mass distribution and angular velocity are related in the conservation of angular momentum.



Students of Mr. Madhavan's AP Physics C Electricity & Magnetism have a nuanced understanding of physics, which enables them to lead the class in problem-solving sessions. The discussion was about electric fields and the arrangement of static charges.



*S*tudents in Ms. Jarmusch and Mrs. Singleton's AP Biology classes' were given a paper with the chemical structure of glucose (C6H12O6) on it. They were asked to pair up with the student next to them and figure out how they would chemically "bond" their two glucose molecules together into a disaccharide, and once they figured out the solution the students were asked to repeat the process with the pair of students next to them to produce a polysaccharide The process continued with students joining their polysaccharides together to form long chains modeling a complex carbohydrate. This was part of their introduction to our Unit 1: "Chemistry of Life" topics and allowed students to explore the topics of dehydration synthesis and hydrolysis.
